Reuben noted that the auditor for this year is not the appointed auditor due to the appointed auditor retiring, so a local Christian auditor stepped in Reuben highlighted that the budget is complicated this year, due to a turbulent year last year and tumultuous future.

Reuben presented charts of historical giving, expenses, RRAC bank balance, noting that giving last year was historically closest to expenses. MUC have prepared smaller budget for 2024 with restructured ministry spending to maximise use. The budget is based on the goal of giving matching 100% of expenses in order to reduce the savings in the general account. This is to prepare for the Diocese restructuring having implications for our bank accounts. During the 2024 transition period the goal is to use up old funds and await further advice from leadership. Gospel Proclaim Townsville has been formed due to concerns over viability of Diocese and the possible financial implications of receivership. GPT was set up by members of RRAC, MUC has been supportive and agreed to partner with GPT. GPT provides stability for future of RRAC in the turbulent times, even if RRAC in its current form ceases to exist. Due to the nature of GPT, RRAC will need to request funds from GPT, they aren't automatically given.

Reuben opens floor to questions

<u>Danielle Bamber</u>: does the \$140,000 in the budget mean giving for both accounts?

 No, just the RRAC account, the giving to both RRAC and GPT is ideally \$200,000

<u>Sally Cavalieri:</u> How much is in GPT and what percentage of people are giving to GPT?

Reuben announced that he will answer GPT questions later in the meeting

Braden Gabel: Which numbers are presented in the budget?

- Only RRAC bank account, not GPT giving

Robyn Shaw: Where did the MTS grant come from?

- Gospel Future Fund

#### Sally Cavalieri: how much is in GPT

 GPT has seed funding and regular giving which totals \$81,000, regular giving making up \$38,000. It is not enough to run RRAC for a year, but an emergency fund





# RRAC AGM Fe Minutes 20

Feb 2024

 Tom announces that the GPT figures are discussed at MUC every month, as the council considers properly what the overall giving is, and Reuben announces that there will be a GPT AGM which people will be able to attend

#### <u>Lorraine Hardacre</u>: Do other churches have GPT?

- No, it's a new thing but not an uncommon thing, other churches have trusts, which is the old way of doing what GPT aims to do

#### Glen Elsegood – is GPT secure during Diocese restructuring?

 Reuben says it's impossible to tell, but GPT is legally structured in a way that it is its own entity and sheltered

#### Danielle Bamber: percentage split of giving to GPT vs RRAC

- Historically the giving has been 2/3 to RRAC, 1/3 to GPT, but recently the gap decreased to roughly 50% vs 50%, with the giving percentage to GPT increasing every month

## <u>John Bamber</u>: Will RRAC accounts decrease to the point of requesting support from GPT?

 Yes, it will happen this year that the money will be required and requested, and the money that is requested is assessable by the Diocese, at a rate of 18% which has been accounted for in the budget

<u>Danielle Bamber</u>: Will Anglican Church of NQ get to the point that it cannot pay victims of abuse, including via property sales?

- Yes, there will be a point that the old legal entity will no longer be able to pay those bills, has been coming for a long time. There have been a lot of unforeseen complications including property being unable to be sold to fund compensation. However, the compensation will very likely be paid, but may not come from Diocese or Anglican Church.
- <u>Sally Cavalieri</u> notes that the Diocese has recently sold bishops house, there's no point in trying to sell some of the properties, particularly remote properties due to low value

Macey Bielenberg: What happens to the unsold properties?

- They will continue to be owned and used by Anglican church, but likely to remain empty unless utilised, for example Julia Creek

<u>Rami Coleman:</u> – Does the North Queensland Diocese going into receivership affect other Dioceses?

- We will not know until it happens, there is only one other similar case, so precedence needs to be set in court

#### 2024 Children's Ministry AGM Report Ross River Anglican Church Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2025

The children's ministry at RRAC seeks to partner with families to teach the Gospel clearly, in age-appropriate ways, so that children may grow up to become disciples of Christ, putting their faith and trust in Him. We strive to provide a safe and welcoming environment where all children can learn more about our awesome King Jesus!

#### Looking back on 2024 -

2024 was a fruitful year for RRAC's kids church ministry. Despite having a smaller group of "core regular attendees", we had a large number of children who visited throughout the year with many of our regular kids bringing friends along. It has been a privilege to continue to watch children grow deeper in their relationship with Christ throughout 2024.

The kids program runs during our Sunday morning service & caters for children in grade 6 and below. We spend time singing, listening to a Bible story before dividing into 3 smaller groups for age-appropriate Bible teaching, games and crafts. During 2024, the children studied from Matthew 8-13, Romans 1-6, Daniel, Titus & spent 5 weeks looking deeper into the Christmas story. Special events included an Easter Egg Hunt and Nativity play where we had the biggest group of children involved to date – including 10 tiny little camels aged under 5! How special it was for the children to share the good news of Jesus birth!

One particular story to share: during school holidays, the children watch a Bible-based DVD instead of their regular program. At the end of the year they watched a DVD about Jospeh. After it had finished, one child said "I don't think this bit is in the Bible" and another child said "Let's check the Bible to find out". Without any leader prompting, the children got their Bibles, looked up the relevant passages to find the answer – how encouraging it is to see our children excited to read God's word for themselves!

Childsafety remains a priority for RRAC with all kids church leaders holding a valid Blue Card & completing online childsafety training every 3 years. The kids church leaders were also upskilled during two training lunches which included topics such as answering Kids guestions.

#### Please pray as we look forward to 2025 -

- **Praise God:** Praise God for the families at RRAC and for the excitement of children to read God's word for themselves and learn more about Jesus. Praise God for the those children who will visit RRAC and attend the kids church program in 2025.
- **Pray for children:** That they will grow up with a clear understanding of the Gospel and place their faith and trust in Jesus. Pray that they may have listening ears, hearts which are eager to learn and be welcoming to new children each week.
- **Pray for leaders:** Please pray that God will raise up who will faithfully teach the Gospel clearly, with enthusiasm and kindness.
- **Pray for parents:** That they will be strengthened as they teach their children about Jesus at home. Pray they may speak about Jesus clearly.

#### Wardens Report for 2024 AGM 2025 Ross River Anglican Church

#### **Finances**

Over our history as a church we have been able to grow a bank balance that has meant that since employing Tom we have met budget partly through giving and partly through savings. We began 2024 with the goal of meeting our full budget expenses from giving. In God's kindness we not only met budget but exceeded it. This is a significant step in the growth of the church to be able to start thinking not just how we pay the bills but how we can grow the ministry in the future. We are very thankful to God for the generosity of his people and the thoughtful and considered sacrificial giving.

#### Gospel Proclaim Townsville Partnership

A significant portion of our giving comes from the local charity Gospel Proclaim Townsville which many of our members give directly to. This partnership is going well and enables us to think long term with confidence despite the ongoing uncertainty of the diocese finances.

#### The Cathedral School

We are very thankful for the ongoing relationship with the Cathedral school where we meet. For Sunday services and our kids' ministries on Friday the school generously allows us to use their facilities. We are very keen to continue to serve the school community by providing access to faithful, age-appropriate Bible teaching and pray for more people in the school to come to know Jesus. We realise that the facilities we enjoy are well beyond what we could afford on our own and we thank God for providing for us.

#### Ministry highlights

Tom's rector's report will cover the ministry more fully. The Wardens want to note the joy of seeing many people continue to serve the church family with joy and faithfulness. 2024 began with lots of old faces leaving and there were lots of ways people had to step up to care for each other in formal and informal ways. We haven't always done it perfectly but we're thankful for ways people have loved and spoken the truth to one another. As many new people have joined us over the last 12 months it's been very encouraging to see them invest in relationships and become part of the family. We were excited and sad to see David Twohill finish his ministry apprenticeship at the end of 2024. It was with real joy and real cost that we sent David, Karen and Samuel off to college in Sydney but this is exactly what we aim to do as a church. We thank God for them and pray they will be well equipped by their time at college. We also want to express our thanks to God for Tom and his family. Tom's clear Bible

#### **Rector's Report - AGM 2025**

There is much to be thankful to God for by another year of gospel ministry among the saints of Ross River Anglican, I hope you are encouraged by this report.

#### **Build up believers**

We have learned much and been encouraged by Sunday preaching on **Genesis 4-11**, **Daniel, Matthew 8-13**, **Romans 1-3**, **1 Corinthians 8-10 and Titus.** 

We've had an ever growing number studying **John** midweek in Growth Groups, Salties & Fever, supported by **SLOBS** (Study Leaders Own Bible Studies) where leaders are given better support by helping them prepare to lead and receiving more encouragement themselves.

We're thankful for Jason Smart teaching on the **standing firm** from Hebrews at our inaugural 'church day at home' after our cancelled church camp, and Gary Millar at Digging Deeper and Simon Manchester on **Deuteronomy** at NQCC.

Last year was the first full year for our **5pm congregation.** I estimate that since starting we've both gained and lost about 20 people from a starting team of 30. That means we've seen steady growth but it's been hard to feel stable. The same condition applies to morning church, but its effects are heightened in a smaller crowd. This year we have committed to: weekly dinners to help people stay and encourage fellowship, more regular live music to help the quality of our meetings, and to meet every week of the year rather than pause in 'quieter' seasons.

#### Send out workers

It's been a great joy and privilege to have David Twohill as our **MTS Apprentice** these last years, and we're very sad but thankful to have 'sent' the Twohill three to Moore College this year. His absence does leave many opportunities to serve in Salties, Growth Groups and Sundays though!

#### Reach the unreached

Our focus for this year in our evangelism was not on putting on events for people to 'come and see' Jesus, but rather equipping people to 'go and tell' in all of life, especially

encouraging people to read John with individuals using **Word121**. There've been great accounts of people accepting invites, people giving it a go, and joyfully people becoming Christians. We hope people continue using this tool, but hope to supplement it with more regular courses this year.

We also had a big Easter weekend, with an afternoon Good Friday service and morning Easter Sunday followed up with our **Moore mission team** and **Kids Holiday club**. The Moore team was of great value and we had a couple of wonderful Sundays, and a number of events with them. We must pray we can keep up our evangelistic 'heat' even without 20 visiting keen-beans.

#### **Our governance**

I want to say a big thank you on the record again to **The Cathedral School** for continuing to host us. It is a privilege not to have a property to maintain or an expensive rental to support, especially as now as we use it on Sunday and Friday evenings also.

We must continue to praise God for the faithfulness of his people in reversing our perilous financial situation from the middle of 2023. We should take this for granted. We all want to keep 'stretching' ourselves if we want to add more staff or require property.

#### The wider church

We value deeply our partnerships with **BCA** by a visit from Mike Uptin in June and **Compassion** by a visit from Simon Ward in September.

It looked at one point like the **NQ Diocese** was facing effective bankruptcy, which would've had big consequences for us. This has not eventuated, but it is too early to say whether this is a stay of execution or a new lease of life.

#### Personal news

Our family remains very appreciative for all your love and support. Now in our fifth year in Townsville we are thankful to God for sustaining us. We recently purchased a home in Aitkenvale, which some people took as a sign that we are committed to being here long term. This is a mistake, as we already held such a commitment! We just needed a place to live. We look forward to the next five years and what God may bring.

  with others who do this around Australia and beyond.
- Our plan for this year:
  - make every Sunday accessible to the unreached
  - Encourage a culture of personal evangelism and bible reading
  - o and make the most of **Christmas and Easter** opportunities.
  - o 'Onboard' newcomer's meetings after church in March, June, Sept.
  - Hope '25 Guest Event in May
- Our focus for 2025: Run a regular small group evangelistic courses throughout the year.
  - Run a Christianity Explored course (T2) advertised over Easter
  - Run a follow up course (T3) advertised over Hope '25
  - Consider running repeated or new courses in T3 as follow up to Kids Holiday Club.

### Build up believers (Colossians 1:28-29)

- Our goal for every year: We want to grow in our knowledge and love of God more and more, so his Word in the Bible is always front and centre.
- Our plan for this year:
  - o commit to this in expository bible teaching each **Sunday** at 9:30am and 5pm,
  - run **Growth Groups** in Exodus to build up one another by speaking the truth in love.
  - have mens and womens breakfasts (T2)

- and we will encourage attendance at Digging Deeper (T1), Church Camp (T2),
   Church Training Day (T3) & NQCC (T4).
- Our focus for 2025: Continue to see numerical growth in our two congregations at 9:30am and 5pm.
  - Having launched a new evening congregation in May 2023, we wish to give more time to establishing both the 5pm a nd 9:30pm services.
  - We need to recruit, train and support new workers to lead and serve on teams across church.
  - We want to invest in a culture of inviting, welcoming, and integrating into church.
  - Hold six monthly reviews with leadership teams and Council (T2 & T4)

### Send out workers (Matthew 9:38)

- Our goal for every year: We don't want to settle for comfortable, so we will willingly sacrifice our time, talent and treasures in order to see gospel progress within RRAC and beyond. We will equip the saints for service, joyfully send out gospel workers to serve elsewhere that we might be a blessing to others.
- Our plan for this year:
  - We will **train** our Growth Group leaders in our regular **SLOBS** groups in Exodus.

  - We will have a vision month where we look ahead to our ministry for the year and how we can partner prayerfully and financially (T4).
- Our focus for 2025: Build towards employing a second full-time ministry staff worker.
- Each year we hope to have a special focus on youth and children, as an expression of our commitment to all-age ministry.
- Our plan for this year:
  - Sunday morning children's program for preschool and primary age
  - o Run a two half-day kids holiday club in July
- Our 'next-gen' focus for 2025: Re-invest in our Friday night Salties and Fever ministries with more support.
  - We want to **integrate** these ministries more with Sundays
  - We want to reach more new children and families, maybe with food for parents
  - We want to see **new leaders** have an opportunity to serve, grow and teach.
